The problem is, every time the user changes the text, we have to remove the "system" information, and then add the "custom" text. This is a bit slow to do, and a bit of a hassle to do too. Is there any quick way to just do a replace on the custom field for the current issue? A: In JIRA, you can use any text editor you like, and change the field in question. You can preview the changes. Once you're happy, press

save and exit. This process will work if you're editing the field from the issue itself. If you're changing the field from the user interface, you can use a similar process, but you'll want to undo the change when you're done. Simply press "Cancel" in the upper right corner.
